Admission Requirements:

Minimum Entrance Requirements:

A minimum of an appropriate bachelor's degree with subjects in at least two appropriate fields of study to support the teaching methods subjects below:

- To meet the requirement of the mandatory Subject Specialisation of Life Orientation: It is recommended that the prospective student should take a combination of at least two of these fields in his/her undergraduate degree, for example, Sociology, Philosophy, Psychology, Political Science, Human Movement Sciences, Labour Studies and Industrial Studies. Psychology must be one of the fields. At least one of these fields should be taken to NQF Level 7.
- Additionally: To register for the elective Subject Specialisation of English: The degree should include English Language and Literature at NQF Level 7. The following are also acceptable, provided English I is included in the degree: Applied English Language Studies, African Literature, Linguistics, Literary Theory and Communication and Media Studies.
- To register for the elective Subject Specialisation of Geography: The degree should at least include Geography taken up to NQF Level 7.

Special Circumstances:

- Undergraduate qualifications that do not meet the above minimum requirements will need to be considered in their entirety to determine the extent to which academic content, embedded in the degree related to a particular subject, is sufficient to teach that subject at a particular level in schools.
- A completed full second-year academic degree course stretching over two semesters may be considered for subject specialisation.
- Applicants 24 years of age and older who do not meet the above requirements may apply for admission on the basis of Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL).
