#### **APPLICATION SUBMISSION AND DEADLINES**

- All information on this form must be completed, including all required documentation (e.g., referee reports).
- Once completed, upload your addendum to the "My Documents" section of your online application.
- Please do not submit any password-protected documents in the application process.
- Applicants may only apply and attend the selection process for a single campus.
- THE APPLICATION CLOSING DEADLINE IS 9 NOVEMBER 2025. It is the applicant's
  responsibility to ensure that all documentation, including the online referee reports, is
  submitted by the referees directly to SACAP by the closing deadline.
- Incomplete and/or late applications will not be considered.
- Prior to applying, it is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that they can fund their studies. For information on fees or any other queries, please:

## **SELECTION PROCESS**

- Applications are reviewed, and candidates will be notified of the outcome via email by <u>14</u> NOVEMBER 2025.
- Shortlisted candidates will receive a link to an electronic calendar to book an interview slot from and must do so before <u>17:00</u>, <u>20 NOVEMBER 2025</u>.
- Interviews will be held in-person, on campus from 24 NOVEMBER 10 DECEMBER 2025.
  - o All candidates must be available during one of the scheduled interview time slots. No alternative dates or times will be offered for interviews.
  - Candidates who do not make themselves available for an interview during the selection period or fail to reserve their interview slot online by the closing deadline will be deemed unsuccessful.
  - Once all interviews have been completed, the Selection Committee will deliberate, and outcomes will be communicated to all candidates via email. Final outcomes will be sent to candidates by <u>15 DECEMBER 2025.</u>





## **CERTIFICATION**

- The HPCSA provides Form 258 for Registered Counsellors, which outlines their areas of competency. In addition, the HPCSA provides comprehensive guidelines on ethical and professional codes of conduct for all health care professionals in South Africa. One such guideline pertains to fitness for purpose. In light of this, please note the following:
  - o A mental health challenge does not disqualify you from entry into a professional training programme, such as the BPsych Programme.
  - However, SACAP has a professional and ethical responsibility to ensure that graduates entering the field are fit for practice in terms of both skills and conduct. Therefore, all applicants are encouraged, though not required, to disclose any diagnosed or undiagnosed mental health challenges. Disclosure enables SACAP to provide appropriate support during training and ensure compliance with the ethical guidelines established by the HPCSA.
- All applicants must be aware that:
  - All BPsych students undergo regular compulsory progress reviews. If concerns arise regarding competency, intervention and support will be provided as necessary and appropriate.
  - SACAP reserves the right to decide on a student's competency to graduate and consequently practice as a Registered Counsellor. Therefore, SACAP retains the authority to determine if students are unfit for practice.
  - If there are concerns regarding fitness to practice within the professional scope, SACAP reserves the right to withhold certification until all the requirements for the certification have been satisfactorily fulfilled, subject to the existing qualification and registration maximum timeframes.
- Foreign national applicants must be aware that:
  - Upon successfully completing this programme, you will be eligible to write the independent HPCSA board exam to finalise your registration as a Registered Counsellor. However, to write the board exam, the HPCSA requires foreign students to either confirm their eligibility to reside and work in South Africa or to provide the HPCSA with proof of employment.
