- Incomplete and/or late applications will not be considered.

### **SELECTION PROCESS**

- Applications will be reviewed, and candidates will be notified of the outcome via email by MONDAY, 06 OCTOBER 2025.
- Shortlisted candidates will be invited to a selection week on the campus they applied to. Please note and diarise the selection weeks as follows:
  - o Cape Town Campus: Monday, 20 October Friday, 24 October 2025
  - o Johannesburg Campus: Monday, 27 October Friday, 31 October 2025
  - o Pretoria Campus: Monday, 03 November Friday, 07 November 2025
- All shortlisted candidates are expected to be available during their campus selection week. Non-availability will lead to an unsuccessful application.
- After the selection week, the selection committee shall deliberate, and the final outcomes will be communicated to candidates via email during the week following the selection process.
- Please note that SACAP will not provide individual feedback on unsuccessful applications.

#### **CERTIFICATION**

- The HPCSA has developed Form 258 for Registered Counsellors, which outlines their areas of competency. In addition, the HPCSA provides comprehensive guidelines on ethical and professional codes of conduct for all health care professionals in South Africa. One such guideline pertains to fitness for purpose. In light of this, please note the following:
  - o A mental health challenge does not disqualify you from entry into a professional training programme, such as the BPsych Equivalence Programme.
  - However, SACAP has a professional and ethical responsibility to ensure that graduates entering the field are fit for practice in terms of both skills and conduct. Therefore, all applicants are encouraged, though not required, to disclose any diagnosed or undiagnosed mental health challenges. Disclosure enables SACAP to provide appropriate support during training and ensure compliance with the ethical guidelines established by the HPCSA.





- All applicants must be aware that:
  - All BPsych Equivalent students are required to participate in regular progress reviews. If concerns about competency are identified, appropriate interventions and support will be provided to address these concerns.
  - SACAP reserves the right to determine a student's competency to graduate and thereby practice as a Registered Counsellor. Accordingly, SACAP may determine that a student is not fit for practice.
  - If there are concerns around fitness to practice within the professional scope, SACAP reserves the right to withhold certification until such time as all the requirements for certification have been satisfactorily fulfilled, subject to the existing qualification and registration maximum timeframes.
- Foreign national applicants must be aware that:
  - Upon successful completion of this programme, you will be eligible to write the independent HPCSA board exam to complete your registration as a Registered Counsellor. However, to write the board exam, the HPCSA requires foreign students to either confirm their eligibility to reside and work in South Africa or to provide the HPCSA with proof of employment.
