The next stage of the application process is to complete the online Addendum and arrange for two referee reports to be submitted. Your application will not be considered complete until both the Addendum and the two referee reports have been received.

All outstanding items must be submitted by the application closing date of **30 October 2026**.

Please share the link to the referee report with **two** individuals who have the professional and academic knowledge to provide meaningful responses about you. **Please note that family members and friends are not considered suitable referees.** Those you know from a professional or educational environment are best suited to complete the attached reference reports.

It is essential that your referees include your preferred name and surname exactly as you provided in your application. Failure to do so may result in the references not being accurately matched to your application, which could render it incomplete and unsuccessful.

The Addendum is comprehensive and may take some time to complete. We recommend preparing and reviewing your responses to the longer questions before starting the online form. The questions are provided below for your convenience.

- Why are you interested in pursuing the Bachelor of Psychology? (Max 200 words)
- What is your understanding of the role Registered Counsellors play in the provision of mental health care services in South Africa? (Max 200 words)
- Provide a brief personal reflection of the key experiences that have shaped you as an individual. (Max 300 words)



Please also read the important information below before completing your application.

Application Submission and Deadlines

- The application closing deadline is 30 October 2026.
- It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that all documentation, including the online addendum and referee reports, are submitted by the closing deadline.
- Applicants may only apply and attend the selection process for a single campus.
- Incomplete and/or late applications will not be considered.
- Before applying, it is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that they can fund their studies.

Selection Process

- Applications are reviewed, and candidates will be notified of the outcome via email by 9 NOVEMBER 2026.
- Shortlisted candidates will receive a link to an electronic calendar to book an interview slot from and must do so before 17:00, 13 NOVEMBER 2026.
- Interviews will be held in-person, on campus from 16 NOVEMBER - 9 DECEMBER 2026.
 - All candidates must be available during one of the scheduled interview time slots. No alternative dates or times will be offered for interviews.
 - Candidates who do not make themselves available for an interview during the selection period or fail to reserve their interview slot online by the closing deadline will be deemed unsuccessful.
 - Once all interviews have been completed, the Selection Committee will deliberate, and outcomes will be communicated to all candidates via email. Final outcomes will be sent to candidates by 14 DECEMBER 2026.

Certification

The HPCSA has developed Form 258 for Registered Counsellors, which outlines their areas of competency. In addition, the HPCSA provides comprehensive guidelines on ethical and professional codes of conduct for all health care professionals in South Africa. One such guideline pertains to fitness for purpose. In light of this, please note the following:

- A mental health challenge does not disqualify you from entry into a professional training programme, such as the Bachelor of Psychology.
- However, SACAP has a professional and ethical responsibility to ensure that graduates entering the field are fit for practice in terms of both skills and conduct.
- Therefore, all applicants are encouraged, though not required, to disclose any diagnosed or undiagnosed mental health challenges. Disclosure enables SACAP to provide appropriate



support during training and ensure compliance with the ethical guidelines established by the HPCSA.

All applicants must be aware that:

- All BPsych students are required to participate in regular progress reviews. If concerns about competency are identified, appropriate interventions and support will be provided to address these concerns.
- SACAP reserves the right to determine a student's competency to graduate and thereby practice as a Registered Counsellor. Accordingly, SACAP may determine that a student is not fit for practice.
- If there are concerns around fitness to practice within the professional scope, SACAP reserves the right to withhold certification until such time as all the requirements for certification have been satisfactorily fulfilled, subject to the existing qualification and registration maximum timeframes.

Foreign national applicants must be aware that:

- Upon successful completion of this programme, you will be eligible to write the independent HPCSA board exam to complete your registration as a Registered Counsellor.
- However, to write the board exam, the HPCSA requires foreign students to either confirm their eligibility to reside and work in South Africa or to provide the HPCSA with proof of employment.
